SATISFACTORY SURVEY REPORTS CHANDRA KAMAL BEZBARUAH COMMERCE COLLEGE, JORHAT

B.COM STUDENTS

A Student Satisfactory Survey (SSS) was conducted by TLE Committee for the session 2018-2019 among 225 students of B.Com III Semester class. A questionnaire consisting of 19 questions was designed and distributed. Out of the total respondents, 24% of them did not return the questionnaire. 5 point Likert Scale is used for collection of data: i.e. (SA=Strongly Agree, A= Agree, N=Neutral, D=Disagree and SD=Strongly Disagree. A separate column is kept to show no response (NR) from the respondents. The analysis shows that 68% of the respondents strongly agreed that IA marks are displayed in departmental notice board, 42% of the respondents strongly agreed that assignment work is properly evaluated whereas 16% of the respondents remained neutral. 38% of the respondents opined that there is fairness in internal evaluation. Only 4% of the respondents strongly agreed that ICT are used in the college followed by 6.7% that totally disagreed, whereas 1% of the respondents did not respond to the question. 4% of the respondents strongly agreed that student centric methods are used followed by 12% that totally disagreed and 34% opined neutral. 17% of the respondents strongly agreed that the Mentoring process is satisfactory followed by 29% that agreed whereas 3% of the respondents did not respond to the question. 29% strongly agreed that the overall quality of Teaching Learning in the college is satisfactory followed by 0.4% that strongly disagreed; 16% remained neutral.

BBA STUDENTS

A Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted by TLE Committee for the session 2018-2019 among 14 students of BBA Semester III class. A questionnaire consisting of 16 questions was designed and distributed, 5 point Likert Scale is used to analyse the data i.e. SA=Strongly Agree, A=Agree, N=Neutral, D=Disagree and SD=Strongly Disagree. A separate column is kept to show the No Response (NR) from the respondents. The Survey shows that 36% of the respondents strongly agreed that students' teacher relationship is very good. 14% strongly agreed that there is enough scope for co-curricular activities; 86% of the respondents agreed that ICT is used in the classroom, and 36% remained neutral. Only 7% of the respondents agreed that post-evaluation Counselling is done whereas 57% disagreed; 29% of the respondents agreed that the overall quality of Teaching Learning is satisfactory followed by 57% who remained neutral and 14% strongly disagreed.
