#### 1.1 - Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

1.1.1 Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Chandra Kamal Bezbaruah Commerce College is affiliated to Dibrugarh University and hence abides by the curriculum prescribed by the university. To ensure effective curriculum delivery, the Academic Council; consisting of the Principal of the college, the Vice-Principal, the IQAC Coordinator, the Heads of the various departments and the teachers of single faculty department, sit together to deliberate and map out the mechanism for effective delivery and documentation of the curriculum as specified by Dibrugarh University. The Academic Council sits at the beginning of the session to discuss and plan the various ways of ensuring sure-fire delivery of the courses included in the curriculum and its implementation thereof in the college. Further, the college administration ensures the availability of qualified and competent teachers before the beginning of the academic year. For every vacant post, the administration, with the consent of the management, places its requirements to the office of the DHE (Director, Higher Education) so that the process of appointment(s) can be initiated. The Academic Council members then chalk out the relevant courses of the curriculum to be taught in the college. The contents of the courses are discussed and then distributed to the concerned departments. The heads of the departments then hold department meetings and analyses the course contents in detail. They make an in-depth analysis for completion of course within the stipulated time. In the department meetings, topics are distributed among teachers per semester. Besides, the institution has an Academic Calendar Committee and a Routine Committee that functions under the guidance of the IQAC. Keeping in mind the Dibrugarh University guidelines, the Academic Calendar Committee puts in order the number of teaching days available in every month of the academic year, and also earmarks the days for various co curricular & extracurricular activities pertaining to the college. The Routine Committee of the college prepares the general time table for all the departments in toto, taking into consideration the individual need and available infrastructure of each department. The Heads of Department then distribute and allocate the teaching workload among the departmental members after which a departmental routine and the concomitant teaching plan is prepared. The documentation of curriculum delivery is done at different levels. The Internal Examination Committee records the overall delivery of the entire curriculum. It is also recorded in the proceedings of the department meetings. With the COVID-19 outbreak, learning in blended mode has acquired a whole new meaning. 1.4.2 – How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

#### Feedback Obtained

Effective feedback, whether academic, co-curricular or institutional, aids in enhancing learning and in improving the overall performance and growth of an institution. The college puts into practice several methods to attain feedback from its various stakeholders. Stakeholders are encouraged to express their views and reflections by communicating with the Principal via the official email which is in the public domain, like the college website, academic calendar and the college prospectus. Most of the time, feedback from students are collected for every program or course run by the institution above and beyond the other regular feedback collected from them at the end of each semester. The feedback forms are student-friendly and specifically designed to obtain the evaluation and estimation on teaching and learning and the infrastructure provided. The college app and the college website play a big role in this regard. Days are set aside in each semester to take the feedback from students. Google feedback forms are prepared and posted online in the college app wherein a deadline is fixed for submission. Further, the Principal and Faculty of the college meet the student representatives regularly in scheduled meetings where they get the opportunity to air their views. A few instances are: i) Observation of Saraswati Puja- responsibility largely shouldered by the student community of the college as it sees footfalls of 1000-1500 visitors annually and everyone is provided with prasad and lunch. This takes place in January-February and it is at this time that feedback is also collected informally from students, alumnae and even parents. ii) During College Week- responsibility is largely shouldered by the student community of the college. This also takes place generally in January-February since December is winter break, and it is at this time that we also receive informal feedbacks. iii) During Students' Union Election- It normally takes place in September-October and students give free rein regarding their requirements and suggestions. iv) IQAC Meetings- Two student representatives (usually the President and the General Secretary) are invited to put forward their ideas and propositions. Also, the internal examination committee sits with the IQAC of the college and other academic faculty for in-house academic audit to discuss and decide on the remedial measures that are necessitated based on the feedbacks collated and the performance of the students in their exams. Feedback is also received from the guardian/parent member of the college IQAC. A Complaint Box is placed in the portico of the administrative block, for the students, to put in their complaints or suggestions. The Soft Skills and Communication Skills Course conducted annually is a result of feedback collected from students. A course in Tally ERP is also on the anvil as students have indicated their requirement for it. This year, one of our teachers, Shri Shobhan Saikia, HoD of Mathematics and Statistics, apprised the University of the lengthy syllabus of Mathematics prescribed for B.Com. 4th Semester (Honours) Course, under CBCS. This request was made as a response to the informal feedbacks received from the students.

#### 2.3.2 – Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

Chandra Kamal Bezbaruah Commerce College understands the importance of mentoring for the all-round development of each and every student of the College. The Guru-Shishya camaraderie and rapport of the college is something that many visitors, onlookers and past students vouch for. Further, the teacher-mentors realize that especially during the current pandemic times, the students have to be kept busy and adequately motivated in order to combat any pessimistic emotions and hurdles that may arise out of the present crises. Each student is under the care and guidance of a faculty mentor for academic and personal matters at the beginning of the academic session. Mentors are assigned to monitor the students all through the three years of the undergraduate course. They meet and interact with their respective mentees regularly with regard to their studies and extracurricular activities. The strengths and weaknesses of the students are analyzed and guidance given accordingly. Fast and slow learners are identified and steps and measures taken as per their need and requirements. Teacher-Mentors provide ample encouragement to their mentees to participate in sports, NSS, NCC, Yoga Workshops, Self-Defense Classes, Social Service Groups, Cultural and other Fine Arts events. Mentors exchange notes with their fellow colleagues for the sake of his/her ward and they have come together many a times to bail out respective students in the best possible way- especially if it is concerned with medical issues or penury. The mentors together decide the names of the most deserving mentees for the Teachers' Inspiration Scholarships, Memorial Scholarships, Scholarships given by Industries, etc. The mentors make sure that the financially needy and meritorious students are not left on the back burner. At times, Mentors coordinate with the mentee's parents regarding the progress and development of the students. The Students Mentoring system is functioning with the following objectives: • To bridge the gap between teachers and students. • To create and maintain healthy teaching-learning environment in the institution. • To motivate, facilitate, advice and support students in both academic and co-curricular matters. • To find out individual Strength and Weakness of the students and rectify, if needed. • To motivate students to maintain proper physical and mental health during the pandemic. • To create opportunities for mentees to release stress during lockdown. The institution has the

following mechanism for students mentoring: • Students Mentoring is being continued for the earlier sessions according to the existing distribution. • For the Session 2019-2020 (starting from July 2019 to June 2020), the total numbers of First semester B.Com. and BBA students are divided in groups among the full-time faculties (excluding Vice Principal) of the institution. • Each Mentor prepares Mentee Profile Form in consultation with each Mentee of the group. • The filled-in Mentee Profile Forms provide both academic and personal information about the Mentee. • Regular meetings, both online and offline, are held between Mentor and Mentee. • Mentors and mentees are connected via WhatsApp groups enabling fast and easy communication.

2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

As an affiliated college, Chandra Kamal Bezbaruah Commerce College follows the directives and guidelines issued by Dibrugarh University on Continuous Internal

Evaluation (CIE). It adheres to the system of Internal Assessment of Papers on Core Course, Discipline Specific Course, Skill Enhancement Course, and Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course. 20 marks is allotted for Internal Assessment of each course. The break-up of Internal Assessment Marks per paper/course is in the following pattern: Marks allotted for 2 (Two) Sessional Exams: 5510 Marks allotted for Attendance: 05 Marks allotted for Group Discussions/Seminars/Practicals, etc.: 05 Following the Covid-19 Pandemic and subsequent lockdown, Assignments were given Online to the students. Regular Tests/Examinations were also conducted through the Online Mode. The college is pleasantly surprised at the positive response of most of their students to this new mode of teaching, learning and evaluation. They have taken it in their stride as duck to water. The schedule for Class Tests/Assignments is notified to the students in advance and uploaded via the all-purpose College App, classwise WhatsApp Groups, Google Classroom or the College Website. The schedules announced are strictly followed. The Principal through the Internal Examination Committee of the College monitors the effective implementation of the schedule. In 2019-20 session, for odd semester, two sessional examinations were conducted. But for the even semester, due to COVID 19 and lockdown, only one Sessional examination for each semester could be conducted centrally by Internal Examination Committee. Discrepancies or grievances of the students, if any, are assessed and resolved by the departments before final submission of marks/report to the Internal Examination Committee of the College. Students air their grievances, if any, via the institutional mail, by communicating to the concerned teacher, or by a convenient medium. In the COVID-19 lockdown period, Internal Assessment Data was uploaded on the University Portal. During the brief lockdown relaxation, the Sessional Marks were displayed in the noticeboards of the respective departments within one week of completion of the Sessional examinations, done usually as per the dates mentioned in the Academic calendar. Special examinations (department wise) were conducted for those students who were unable to appear in the sessional examinations due to genuine reasons. For the First semester students under CBCS, special examinations for credit fulfillment were conducted by concerned departments where students' attendance was inadequate. Test copies and answer sheets were shown to the students and remedial measures taken. Students who are found to be exceptionally weak are given extra attention and consideration. They were made to repeat the same test until they showed improvement. Outstanding students are emboldened to carry on the same tempo of performance. Group discussions, power point seminar presentations by students were conducted by the departments in each semester. Individual and group home assignments were given and checked time to time. For BBA students, Unit Tests were held after the completion of each Unit. The College has a system of Student Feedback, which facilitates effective implementation of evaluation processes.

# 2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

Being an affiliated college of Dibrugarh University, Chandra Kamal Bezbaruah Commerce College prepares its annual academic calendar keeping in mind the notifications issued by the university to its constituent colleges. The notifications of Dibrugarh University, Academic calendar for the general Degree colleges under Dibrugarh University and Annual Holiday list prepared for its affiliated colleges is attached in the Academic calendar. Internal Assessment dates such as Sessional examinations and dates for GD/Seminars and notification of marks thereof are mentioned in the Academic calendar. Semester-end examinations are conducted as per directives and guidelines issued by Dibrugarh University. The college disseminates the information regarding university notices and circulars related to the examinations from time to time through the students' notice board, college app and college website. The Academic calendar also states the dates in which Mentoring and Counselling, Parents Teacher

Meeting, Students Union Election and College Week would be held. There is provision for students to furnish personal memoranda in the Academic calendar. Students can put down notes of daily occurrences in the Academic calendar. They can further record in written form their respective class routines in the Academic calendar. Besides, general information about the college, Vision and Mission of the college, Code of Ethics for Principal, Teachers and Students, Library Rules and Instructions are also mentioned therein. Syllabus for B.Com. and BBA are given in the academic calendar along with pattern of Examination and Evaluation. The consequences of ragging are also prominently highlighted in the academic calendar. During the 2019-20 academic session, following the Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown, the University gave the Sixth Semester students the option of appearing Online or Offline for their Sixth Semester Examination. The College supported the instructions of the University related to the online-offline examination, and conducted it smoothly and proficiently. The process of creating e-mail ids for students had already been done before the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic. Students were asked to communicate their exam-related queries and technical difficulties through their mentors, institutional email id, and phone calls or directly contact Mr. P. Mandal and Mr. R. Saikia, Asst. Profs., who were particularly assigned the task for monitoring the unexpected Online Examination. Abiding by the University Notification, the College assisted and gave full support to the Sixth Semester students who opted for off-line examination making available all the infrastructural needs of the students.

There is no budget allocation for physical and academic facilities. The expenditure in these heads are incurred as and when necessary from development fund. A separate Students' Union Fund is generated through the admission process and the amount is allotted to various activities such as Festival, Major games, Minor games, Cultural, Common Room, etc. Teachers who are nominated as advisors to the various activities coordinate with the respective elected secretaries of the students union for smooth conduct of the different activities. The college has a Building Committee for development and maintenance of infrastructure. The College Development Fund is utilized for maintenance and minor repair of furniture and other electrical equipment.

Canteen facility is available for stakeholders. Hostel facility is available for 35 numbers of girl students. The class rooms are under surveillance of CCTV and micro phone is provided when necessary. The ongoing construction of sports complex and auditorium funded by RUSA and Govt. is likely to be completed soon. The College encourages students' participation in different inter-college events, youth festivals, national and international level sports competitions on a regular and continual basis and they have a track record of outstanding performances in cricket, kick boxing, badminton championships, etc. The College emboldens them by providing incentives, attendance waivers and holding special classes for them. To boost student engagement with sports, the College had allocated one period for each class for Self-defence training for all students and training was also going on in full swing but the COVID-19 lockdown has played spoilsport. The institution has a single functioning computer centre with one fulltime faculty representing the Computer Applications department. He plays a key role in the overall supervision of Computer Science courses but as the Education System has now become very technical, more so due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and consequent lockdown, tech-savvy faculty members of the other departments pitch in to assist in case of any need based requirements, over and above their regular academic work. Further, a recruit with an MCA degree is specifically appointed on ad hoc basis to take care of the CollegeApp from which important information is regularly disseminated to the students. The computer machines are optimally utilized for academic, administrative and examination related work. An internal ICT Committee is constituted for the overall maintenance and updating of its Systems and Network. The College has a well-equipped library with internet facility and CCTV cameras for overall monitoring and surveillance. Hygienic toilet for both boys and girls, Xerox, Drinking Water and Suggestion Box facilities are provided. Proper account of visitors on daily basis is maintained. National and Regional papers are available for readers and the fund is maintained by college authority. UGC grants are used for purchase of books and journals. The HODs communicate their requirements of books to the Librarian. All books and journals are routed through the Library Committee members before the purchase orders are finalized. The Library Advisory Committee is responsible for effective running of the Library and purchase of library resources.

5.3.2 – Activity of Student Council & representation of students on academic & administrative bodies/committees of the institution (maximum 500 words)

The Student Council of the college is an annually elected body and along with other student representatives, they work in tandem with the administration. This year during the COVID-19 pandemic, 20 students nobly and enthusiastically participated in Food and Relief distribution programs, 4 students voluntarily donated blood, 33 students participated in the Swachh Bharat Fit India Plogging Run, 2 students participated in a State Level organized Skill Festival, 100 students attended a Talk on Gender Sensitization and Sexual Harassment, 70

students participated in a Youth Camp on Inner Awareness and Personal Growth, 10 students participated in the Mega Free Medical Camp organized in association with Jorhat Rotary. In September 2019, 45 students participated in a Statelevel Quiz Competition organized by Vivekananda Kendra Kanyakumari, Assam Chapter, Jorhat under the mission of Ek Bharat Vijayi Bharat. The Annual College Week, organized by the students themselves, saw enthusiastic participation of many. Saraswati Puja, as usual, was celebrated with great solemnity and gaiety. Solemn, because the first half of the day witness elders, pious students (both past and present), retired and current teachers of the college, and other visitors bowing in obeisance and offering prayers to the Goddess of Learning. The second half of the day presents a scene of gaiety since the college appears to be sprinkled with a riot of colours. Students of the college (both past and present- almost like an Alumni Meet) and those belonging to nearby educational institutions flock in huge numbers dressed in their best traditional finery. This year's Saraswati Puja fell on January 29, 2020 and the institution witnessed approximately 1200 footfalls. Leading from the front, members of the Student Council are present in the IQAC, Sports Committees, Cultural Committees, Ragging Committee, Discipline Committee, Admission Committees, Girls' Hostel Committee, etc. As members, the Student Council give valuable feedback which the college acts upon at the earliest. They also oversee the participation of the college in the different intercollege competitions of the "Youth Festival" organized by the affiliating university. During the admission process every year, the Student Council along with student volunteers offer their assistance by setting up Help Desks in the college premises. Another notable and praiseworthy work they did this year was to collect and distribute their used books for free to the economically weak students. Other programs organized exclusively by the students with guidance from faculty are Freshers' Social, Parting Social, Teachers' day, Shankardev Tithi, Silpi Divas, Rabha Divas, Asom Diwas, Environment Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Ekta Divas, Constitution Day, Republic Day and Independence Day, etc. The "Parivartan" group, a community of students immersed in Social Service and Extension, wherein 90 of its members belong to the institution, had conducted various programs and activities for the welfare of the society. Student members play a key role in DELVESS (Department of English- Literature Values and English Studies Society), a society instituted by the Department of English, to promote literary and soft skill activities in addition to providing a platform to tap and express creativity.

The management and governance of Chandra Kamal Bezbaruah Commerce College is egalitarian and participative. It is under the canopy and supervision of a responsible and experienced Governing Body to whom the Principal and Faculty of the Institution or any stakeholder can turn to for counsel and direction whenever required. The institution recognizes and acknowledges the faithful service of its staff-teaching or non-teaching. In harmony with its vision and mission, the college grants operational autonomy to the various heads and conveners of committees and sub-committees constituted for the smooth functioning of business. Decentralization of power is especially visible in terms of women gaining ground. The portfolio of the Academic Vice-Principal and IQAC Co-ordinator are held by female faculty. As such, faculty members and non-teaching staff (in some tasks, even students) are assigned specific roles and responsibilities in committees and sub-committees such as the Academic Council, IQAC, Finance Committee, Admission Committee, Internal Examination Committee, Library Committee, Career Counselling Cell, Women Cell, Hostel Committee, Campus Maintenance Committee, Students' Welfare and Grievance Redressal Committee, Students' Mentoring Committee, Routine Committee, Prospectus Committee, Academic Calendar Committee, Building/Construction Committee, Canteen Monitoring Committee, Cultural Committee, NCC Wing, NSS Wing, Cine Club, and such other relevant committees. The institution also practices devolution of leadership roles in the BBA program that it runs under the umbrella of Dibrugarh University. The CKBCC School of Management Studies was earlier helmed by senior faculty members of the institution but in 2019-20, the charge of Coordinator was given to a capable and experienced young faculty who is also an ex-student of the college. The BBA Coordinator and his team is running the show meticulously and with enthusiasm. The BBA Advisory Committee spearheaded by the Principal of the institution meets regularly to keep track of academic and other related matters.

University, the College as per its direction, has adopted Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) at the UG Level from 2019-20. It follows the Dibrugarh University Syllabus for the B. Com and BBA Undergraduate program. The college got the approval to open Study Centres from DODLDU (Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University), and KKHSOU (Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University) in 2019-20 and the curricula of the respective universities are adhered to. The Communicative and Soft Skills Course was conducted in the online mode due to the COVID-19 situation by NIELIT as per their curriculum. Teaching and Learning Appointment procedure is transparent and Teacher Quality is notable with 13 Ph.D. and 5 M.Phil. Awardees. 2 teachers are pursuing their Ph.D. Faculty members are striving to upgrade their academic quality by attending Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), Skill Development and Training Workshops and Conferences, subsequently transferring knowledge and transforming the minds of students. In 2019-20, the IQAC piloted an FDP for teaching faculty within and outside the institution, and a Skill Training Program for the office staff. Students' learning skills are enhanced through participation in trainings, seminars and workshops. Feedback is obtained from students for improving teaching learning method. Examination and Evaluation The Examination and Evaluation process is an integral part of the learning process and for the advancement of a course. The College has an Internal Examination Committee who along with the Principal put their heads together to devise strategies for effective conduct of examination. Unit wise assignments, class tests, seminars, two sessional exams, group discussions, regularity in attendance and seminar presentations are several methods of internal evaluation. The end semester exams are held as per direction of Dibrugarh University. Examination and evaluation related matters communicated from the University are stated in the Orientation Program, and printed in the Academic Calendar, College Prospectus,

	College Website, etc. to ensure transparency and clarity.

7.1.7 - Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly (at least five)

- 8. Before beginning the Fit India Plogging Run towards the town, participating students and teachers first of all had cleaned the college campus.
- 9. The institution has maintained the tradition of gifting a sapling to the chief guest of every function. And every important function program organized by the college begins with planting of a sapling.
  - 10. Students are also sometimes ask to tend to a plant at home or in the institution as a corrective measure.
  - 11. The college makes sure that electrical gadgets are used sparingly and unnecessary wastage is avoided.
- 12. Use of pesticides and other harmful chemicals is almost absent as organic methods of gardening is mostly carried out.
  - 13. Mild chemicals are used for cleaning and maintaining the campus.
- 14. In order to keep the campus smoke free as much as possible, dead leaves and waste papers are scientifically decomposed off by throwing them in pits dug specially for the purpose, and then covering them with soil.
- 1. Potted plants and trees speckle the college courtyard. Varieties such as Areca palm, Lady palm, Dwarf Dale palm, Neem, Arjun, etc. are planted to purify the surrounding air.
- 2. Fruit trees that are thoughtfully grown in the campus like amla (Indian Gooseberry), jamun (Java Plum or Black Plum), hilika (Haritaki), etc. often provide the much needed sustenance to students, teaching and non-teaching staff to consume them during recesses.
  - 3. Plantation and cleaning drives are organized regularly by students of the NSS and NCC wings of the College.
    - 4. The three Devadaru (Deodar) saplings planted in the last NAAC Peer Team visit in 2016 are standing tall near the courtyard of the college administrative block.
- 5. The Bakul (Spanish Cherry) saplings planted on the approach road of the college as a Best Practice undertaking a couple of years ago, has also grown to a sufficient length despite the wear and tear caused due to inclement weather and ravenous attack by cows and goats.
  - 6. The institution believes in plantation and nurturing and tending its flowers, plants and trees are given utmost priority. Then only will the students and staff enjoy the sights and sounds around.
  - 7. The institution was also the first college to be declared tobacco-free in the district.

#### 7.2.1 - Describe at least two institutional best practices

Best Practice A: 2019-20 1. Title of the Practice: Tree Plantation Drive (Go Green) 2. Objectives of the Practice: i. To beautify the college through tree plantation and conservation. ii. To create environmental awareness among students. iii. To make growing and nurturing of plants a day to day practice. iv. To share the green practices adopted by the world community in order to save nature and the environment. 3. The Context: Plants are the lifeline of all living beings of this world. Trees replenish oxygen of the atmosphere, provide food, maintain ecological balance, produce valuable building materials, and are a source of medicine preparation and many more. It is an undoubtedly a fact that until and unless we care for nature we will not be cared or cherished in return. Keeping these points in mind, the college has been adopting plantation drives since years back. 4. The Practice: The College has been conducting various activities within and outside the college campus. A good number of plants, having medicinal value or otherwise, are grown and nurtured within the campus, like amla (Indian Gooseberry), jamun (Java Plum or Black Plum), hilika (Haritaki), Arjun trees, etc. It is worth mentioning that "Aastha" the CKB Commerce Women's Cell, has been playing a very active role in these plantation drives. In the year 2015, it had initiated a plantation programme to plant 22 "Bakul" (Spanish Cherry) saplings in the approach road of the College to serve the twin purpose of beautification as well as preservation of nature. The "Bakul" being a rare variety and having great value, the College Women Cell embedded its saplings on 4th June, which is observed as the Foundation Day of the Cell. Since then, those plants are nurtured not only by the members of the cell but also by the student community. Special appreciation goes to the students belonging to the "Parivartan Group" who, despite the heat and rain, take care of them like their young siblings. Credit further goes to the college gardener who make the effort to regularly monitor their growth. The College authority also provides the resource and materials whenever required. Any programme organized by the Women Cell such as Foundation Day celebration starts with a tree plantation programme. Special guests and Resource Persons invited to the programs are felicitated and gifted with a sapling alongside the traditional gamusa. The NSS unit of the College is also working for the protection of environment and preservation of nature. Its members take the lead in growing plants within the campus on Environment Day and other special occasions like celebration of Women's Day in the Girls' Hostel. The Guava tree near the gate of the Girls' Hostel is one such tree grown thus. The college authority also leads from the front in this endeavour. The beautiful arrangement of potted plants of different varieties in the courtyard and corridors are a sight for sore eyes. It not only enhances the beauty of the Campus but also retains the green environment within the campus. Evidence of Success: The long approach road of the College looks very green and beautiful. The fruit trees that are thoughtfully grown in the campus like amla (Indian Gooseberry), jamun (Java Plum or Black Plum), hilika (Haritaki), etc. often provide the much needed sustenance to students, teaching and non-teaching staff to consume them during recesses. The huge Arjun tree inhabiting the space between the college canteen and college playground is serving a dual purpose: a) It has medicinal value and is used for treating fractures, ulcers, high blood pressure, etc. It has various medicinal properties and acts as antioxidant, anti-inflammatory and antimicrobial. b) The Arjun tree also offers the much needed shade and shelter to the cows who often loiter around in the campus when the gates of the college are open. During the sweltering summer months, students are also noticed sitting underneath the canopy relaxing and delighting in the beauty of the surrounding. 5. Problems encountered and Resource required: During dry season some trees that are planted die due to lack of proper watering. There are plants that need frequent re-plantation.

Moreover the young Bakul Trees planted outside the College campus are eaten by street animals like cow, goat, and re-plantation had to be done in some places. The college authority has directed to make a netted shield and barricade around each plant up to a certain level, giving the plants space to bask in air, water and sunlight. With this measure, the plants are also safe from the four-footed marauders. Best Practice B: 2019-20 1. Title of the Practice: Inspirational Awards to Students 2. Objectives of the Practice: i. To acknowledge the sweat and toil of students. ii. To inspire them to persist in the same spirit in the future. iii. To motivate junior students to work hard in the same way so that they too achieve such honours. 3. The Context: In today's fast paced-world and escalating social media interactions, people especially young students seem to be caught in the vicious circle of existence. The need of motivation has magnified. Young students require extrinsic motivation like external rewards and recognition to give wings to their dreams. Inner zeal and passion alone does not suffice nowadays as there are a lot of pull and push factors. Inspirational Awards can provide the much-needed motivation and push to stretch their learning capacities. An award based on merit can inspire the recipient student to continue doing well in future. 4. The Practice: Keeping in view the above points, Mr. Bimal Chandra Saikia, who retired as Vice-Principal of the college, had pioneered this noble initiative of giving monetary awards to meritorious students of the college. In 2004, B. C. Saikia started by gifting a cash award of Rs. 5000/- (from his modest earnings) to every student who got First Class in Accountancy Major in the B. Com. Final Examination. The flow of awards continued till his retirement in 2012. The Teachers' Unit of the college continued the trailblazing example and thus, two Inspirational Awards are funded by the teachers annually. In addition to the above two awards, two more Memorial Awards are given. These Inspirational Awards are: a) Teachers' Inspiration Award to the College Overall Topper in any Speciality Subject in B.Com. Final Examination conducted by Dibrugarh University. This award includes a cash prize of Rs. 10,000/- and a Certificate of Appreciation. b) Teachers' Inspiration Award to the College Overall Topper in the General Course in B.Com. Final Examination conducted by Dibrugarh University. This award includes a cash prize of Rs. 10,000/- and a Certificate of Appreciation. c) Late Chinmoy Saikia Memorial Award: This annual award, consisting of a cash prize of Rs. 10,000 and a Certificate of Appreciation is given to the College Accountancy Topper in the B. Com. Final Examination conducted by Dibrugarh University. Conferred every year in the memory of Late Chinmoy Saikia, who was an equally brilliant exstudent of the college, the award is handed over by Mrs. M. Saikia, wife of Late Chinmoy Saikia. d) Late Rupak Dutta Memorial Award: This annual award, consisting of a cash prize of Rs. 5,000 and a Certificate of Appreciation, is given to the College Business Management Topper in the B. Com. Final Examination conducted by Dibrugarh University. Conferred every year in the memory of Late Rupak Dutta, who was an exceptional and dynamic teacher of the college, and who passed away while in harness, the award is handed over by Mrs. M. Dutta, wife of Late Rupak Dutta. Problems encountered and resources required: As these awards are given to recently passed-out students, a few are unable to receive the awards during the felicitation ceremony organized by the authority. So, it is handed over in absentia. Further, due to the COVID-19 lockdown, announced since March 2020, the felicitation ceremony of 2019 and 2020 was clubbed together and the awards distributed in early 2021 when there was a hiatus in the lockdown period.

Self Defense Program for Students: Vision of Chandra Kamal Bezbaruah Commerce College: To establish itself as a centre of excellence for ensuring quality in Higher Education by shaping the human resource in the right way and thereby contribute towards uplift of the society and development of the nation. Empowering students has been the call of the day. In this modern era, violence against students especially girl students is becoming very common in every street of both rural and urban setting. They feel insecure the moment they are out of their homes for any purpose. It is very important for everyone to be prepared mentally and physically and be well equipped with required skills and techniques to defend oneself from any kind of anti social elements prevailing in the society today. The purpose of self defense is that the more prepared you are the less likely you will become a victim. The main objectives of the program are: - i) To improve physical conditioning and equip the students to defend themselves against any type of physical assault. ii) To build self confidence so that they can contribute meaningfully to their own development by shaping their own destiny. iii) Capacity enhancement through self defence training. iv) To empower the students in all aspects. v) To develop selfdiscipline The "All Assam Amateur Muaythai Association" started its classes in the college campus for the first time in the year 1985 and has been continuing till date. Since 1985, the college has been providing the venue to conduct self defense training to students irrespective of sex. More than 2000 trainees from greater Jorhat area have been given training till now. Initially only Karate training was given but since 1998 Amateur Muaythai has been added to it and presently both type of training are given under the umbrella of All Assam Amateur Muaythai Association. The different phases of the training are: - Yellow belt (4 months) Orange belt (4 months) Green belt (4 months) Blue belt (4 months) Maroon belt (4 months) Brown belt: Brown 1 (4 months), Brown 2 (4 months), Brown 3 (4 months), Brown 4 (4 months) One year Gap Black Belt Thus, it is a 4 year self defense training program starting from "Yellow" to "Black Belt". Till 2020, out of the total 2000 trainees, Black Belt has been awarded to 212 trainees. And among these 2000 trainees, quite a number of them were/are our students. On September 2, 2019 the College signed an MOU with "All Assam Amateur Muaythai Association" which is affiliated to United Amateur Muaythai Association, India. An agreement was reached to provide Muaythai/ Self Defence classes to the students for an hour on every working day from 2019-20 academic session. Accordingly, till the declaration of the COVID-19 lockdown, self defence classes were going on in full swing as per allotment in the routine.

ERP 9, Skill Development Course in Resource Management, ITES BPO Soft Skills Communicative English for SC/ST students, Soft Skills Personality Development Course, etc. 3) To organize Awareness Program on Women's Health. 4) To organize more Student Development Programs. 5) To organize more Gender Sensitization Programs. 6) To nurture and give more care to the trees and plants of the college campus. 7) To make Yoga and Meditation Course compulsory for the holistic development of students by including it in the Time-Table of the coming academic session. 8) To encourage students' participation in examinations such as those conducted by the NCC Directorate. 9) To sign MOU with other institutions for knowledge exchange (for the benefit of both students as well as faculty), sharing of technological knowhow, and academic collaboration. 10) To encourage Research and Publication. 11) To organize innovative activities to develop creativity in students. 12) To initiate an Expression of Interest with NIELIT for running courses that would help in building employability in ST/SC students of the college. 13) To organize coaching classes to prepare students for competing in competitive and government conducted examinations like NET, Banking Exams, SSC, Railways, etc. 14) To increase extension activities and Community Outreach programs in collaboration with organizations such as Rotary, Parivartan Group, NGOs like HELP, etc. 15) To open an Incubation Centre to tap the potential of young minds and encouraging innovation. 16) To organize Pre-Placement Talks, Workshops, etc. in collaboration with Industry and Academia. 17) To increase the visibility of the institution in the national and international arena. 18) To intensify liaison with the College Alumni for conducting programs and talks beneficial to the students and society.
