24. Feedback from stakeholders :

- a) Students : Most of the students demanded to improve the placement services .

- a) The career guidance cell organized a talk on Srimanta Sankardeva on 12th Dec. 2008. Mr. Ismile Hussain, renowned author was invited to deliver the talk. He spoke on the topic, "Why Sankardeva would not be a greater man than Shakespeare ?"
- b) Under the 'Udyogyoti' Scheme, sponsored by the Government of Assam, the District Industries Centre, Jorhat, selected ten students of the college who were taken to Guwahati for industrial visit. They were taken to NEDFI, Handloom and Textile Industry at Sonapur, a Tiles manufacturing Industry in Shilong, AIDC at Bamunimaidam and a Soap factory and Biscuit factory near Guwahati for giving exposure to different entrepreneurial activities.
