- d) For faculty improvement, a One-day Teacher Workshop onSession Plan was organised by the IQAC, CKBCC on March 20, 2018 in collaboration with Royal Global University, Guwahati.
- e) The IQAC, CKBCC conducted a One-day Workshop on Entrepreneurship Development for B. Com. & BBA 6th Semester students on March 29, 2018. The Workshop, in which 40 students participated, was organised in collaboration with Assam Rajiv Gandhi University of Cooperative Management (ARGUCM).

Item No. 6: Committee-wise discussion on future activities to be implemented

As per discussion in the last meeting, the House requested the Village Adoption Committee members to give an update about the progress of work done. Dr. G.K. Bordoloi opined that the site of the suggested village for adoption, 'Borhuj' and the school 'Puronimati High School' is quite far (about 13 kms) from the college to conveniently carry forward any adoption work. He remarked that it would be feasible if the village to be adopted is located nearby. Mr. D. Borah, the NSS Coordinator of the college, apprised that, as per government order, one Panchayat as a whole is needed to be adopted by a college. Further, as per recent government order, a Health and Sanitation Club is required to be constituted immediately. The following resolutions were taken after the above discussion:

Resolution No. 1:

A Health & Sanitation Club be formed immediately.

Resolution No. 2:

The three committees-Village Adoption Committee, Health & Sanitation Club, and NSS will work in total coordination for the progress and development of the selected Internal Assessment Panchayat.

The Curricular Aspects Committee Chairperson, Mr. Sobhan Saikia, suggested holding of three sessional exams for the degree students and select the best two for IA. But the House was not receptive to the suggestion. The IQAC Coordinator suggested running studentbenefit Value-Added Courses of 30 hours duration such as on Gender Sensitisation, PGDCA, × Entrepreneurship & Skill Devpt., etc. as a Certificate Course or Diploma. The committee was asked to submit field reports to the IQAC.

The Teaching Learning & Evaluation Committee Joint Coordinators, Dr. R. Roy & Mrs. R. Dutta apprised the House of the following plan of action:

a) From the current session, entry to the college will be restricted if students with bikes come without licences and helmets.

b) Mobile zones will be placed, and use of it restricted in the college campus

c) On-line registration of the current B. Com First Sem. Students on the institutional website will be done.

d) Digital database of students will be created.

e) For Student Satisfaction Survey, mentors for each student will be engaged. In this connection, 3 days of Counselling and Mentoring is allotted in the Academic Calendar, and PTM dates are also given. 2018

f) Sessional Exams should be completed within 2 days and marks and remarks made known soon after. Followed with Counselling Sessions for those in need.

g) For the weaker and mediocre students, arrangements will be made for extra coaching and so also for the advanced learners.

Further, the TLE committee opined that practical classes should be allotted for the students taking Computer/ITAB.

The House gave the TLE Committee and the Students Support & Progression Committee the ${\mathscr S}$ combined task of distribution of mentors and mentees.

Also, practicing the policy of decentralization and delegation of power and responsibility, the House gave the go-ahead to the concerned departments to decide on the intake capacity of major students.

The Institutional Values & Best PracticesCommittee has decided to keep track of the attendance record of the students every month. The Joint Coordinators Mr. H. Das & Mrs. M. Das said that parents of students whose attendance is found below 75% will be called and if poor attendance is still noticed, the authority will be requested to take suitable action. They further spoke of organising workshops on Journalism and Mass Communication, and Assamese Tradition & Culture in order to develop employability and the sense of culture & tradition in the students. The IQAC Coordinator suggested that a Workshop on Bhaona as well as on Intellectual Property Rights can be taken up. The Principal proposed that a course on Xattriya Dance can also be arranged. attrice

The committee members further stated that Tele-conferencing facilities be implemented in the college at the earliest. H. Das also expressed that the proceedings of the last six meetings of the GB should be made available so that one can work on improving if there are any drawbacks, and the faculty too will be apprised of the decisions/resolutions taken by the GB. Also, the college should work concentrating on the shortcomings mentioned by the NAAC Peer Team on its last visit.

The Infrastructure & Learning Resources CommitteeConvener, Mr. R. Sarmah, expressed that no formal discussion/meeting as such was held by them since the committee is directly related to the authority. The committee opined that internet facility is not always easily accessible in the college. The committee put forward the view that developing e-learning facilities can greatly benefit the students. The student-computer ratio is not ideal and few of the computers need repairing. The members suggested that a part of the RUSA grant can be used for purchasing additional new computers.

The Student Support & Progression Committee has taken up and completed a few important activities. In their formal meetings, they have identified areas on which they can work on. Such as:

a) Academics- focus on industry exposure b) Psychological/Social issues- focus on stress management, health, festival, sports, etc.

The CP, Dr. P. Borthakur and the Convener, Mr. N. Konwar articulated that special care and attention should be given to economically weak students, maybe by issuing extra books from the Library. The Committee also proposed house visits to apprise and interact with parents of students showing weak attendance and poor academic performance.

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S. Borah remarked that Orientation in 'Office Management' for the Office Staff can be organised to formal meeting was held since its activities are related to other sub-committees. The Convener, Dr. guide them on aspects such as e-filing. The members further opined that updating of proceedings of Nembers of the Governance, Leadership & Management Committeeinformed the House that no meetings should be done immediately with proper coordination.

The Research Innovation & Extension Committee members raised the topic of a joint book on Commercial Terms to be published by the MIL Deptt. The concerned deptt. was asked to expedite the work for its publication.
