1. INTRODUCTION

Chandra Kamal Bezbaruah Commerce College, one of the premier provincialized institutions imparting Commerce Education in the North-East Region is situated at the heart of Jorhat town. This full-fledged Commerce College was established in 1965 with the vision of producing a good number of able commerce graduates to promote entrepreneurial activities and to shoulder various responsibilities in Trade, Industry, and Commerce and also to provide them with the opportunity to build up their professional careers like Chartered Accountants, Cost and Management Accountants, M.B.A. etc. The College has celebrated its Glorious Golden Jubilee and buckled up to celebrate its Diamond Jubilee in 2024-25.

The College always remembers the remarkable sacrifice of a few enthusiastic founder teachers who took all pains to translate the dream of the College in to reality. Under the leadership and able guidance of founder principal Late Madhab Chandra Chakrabarty as well as the sincere devotion of founder teachers Late Dwijendra Nath Sarmah, Shri Anil Chandra Sarmah and Shri Khagendra Nath Sarmah Baruah Commerce education gradually flourished. In 1974 the College was brought under the Deficit Grant-in-Aid system, and in the same year, it was recognized by University Grants Commission. The Government of Assam from the year 2005 provincialized the College.

The College started with only 130 students. Until today this college has produced more than 12,000 graduates, most of whom are well-placed in society. Presently more than 1,200 students are studying in this College. Moreover, this College has a dedicated teaching staff with 26 members. The College has a rich computerized library with nearly 35,000 books in addition to journals, magazines, and newspapers.

- b) Four years Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.Hons.) course under Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) under Dibrugarh University.
- c) Three years Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.Hons.) course under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) under Dibrugarh University.
- d) Three years Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) course under Dibrugarh University.
- e) Two years Higher Secondary course of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.
- f) Certificate, Diploma, Degree, Master Degree, P.G. Diploma Programme under IGNOU. The programmes are open to all.
- g) B.Com/M.Com under Directorate of Distance Education under Dibrugarh University.
- a) Certificate, Diploma, Degree, Master Degree, P.G. Diploma Programme under KKHSOU.

The College has only Day shift and admission in the Day Shift is open for both male and female students.

4.1 MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

4.2 BACHELOROFCOMMERCE

Four years Undergraduate Program in Commerce (B.Com.) consists of eight semesters with multiple entry and exit. The program guidelines are under construction as per the latest NEP Guidelines. For details, visit Dibrugarh University website.

DEFINITIONS:

- a) Undergraduate Programmes: Undergraduate programmes will include the following
 - (i) UG Certificate programme: UG Certificate Programme leads to a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG certificate (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 44 Credits on completion of Semester II if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.
 - (ii) UG Diploma Programme: UG Diploma Programme leads to a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG Diploma (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 88 Credits on completion of Semester IV if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based 5 vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the maximum period of seven years.
 - (iii) Three Year UG Degree Programme(B. Com) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year (6 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing a minimum of 132 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.
 - (iv) Four Year UG Programme with honours (B. Com) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.
 - (v) Four Year UG Programme with honours with Research (B. Com) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours and research degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years

with a rigorous research project, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

- **b) CBCS:** CBCSmeansChoiceBasedCreditSystem.Choice-BasedCreditSystemisaflexiblesystem oflearning. '*Credit*' definesthequantumofcontents/syllabusprescribedforacourseanddetermines the number of hours of instruction required. This system permits students to -
 - **O**Learn at their own pace.
 - ©Choose electives from a wide range of Elective Courses offered for the programme.
 - Oundergo additional courses and acquire more than the required number of credits.
 - Adopt an interdisciplinary approach to learning.
 - Make the best use of the expertise of available faculty.
- c) Credit: 'Credit' defines the quantum of contents/syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. Thus, normally in each of the courses, credits will be assigned on the basis of the number of lectures/ tutorials/ laboratory work and other forms of learning required to complete the course contents in a 14–15-week schedule:

i) 1Lecture per week =1Hour duration per week =1 Credit
 ii)1Tutorial per week =1Hour duration per week =1 Credit
 iii)1Practical per week =2Hours duration per week =1 Credit

Note: The lecture sessions and tutorials shall not be substituted with any other activities like seminars, group discussions etc.

- A student shall have to study the academic programme as per the scheme of the Programme. Even
 if a candidate earns the required number of credits before completion of the full duration
 of the programme, he/sheshallnotbeentitled for the degree.
- The course structure of the academic programme under the CBCS shall be as per the Course Structure given in Annexure-I. The nature of the Courses for all Under Graduate Academic programmes shall be as below.
 - a) Core Courses: Compulsory components of an Academic Programme. These Courses are to be compulsorily studied as a core requirement for the programme. The contents of the Core Courses shallbeaspertheUGCModelCurriculumforthesubject/disciplineconcerned.However,theBoardsofStudiesc oncernedmayrecommendamaximumof20% deviationfromtheUGCModelSyllabiwherever requires. In case, UGC does not provide a model Syllabi/Curriculum, the Board of Studies shall propose with other similar subjects/disciplines.
 - **b) Elective Courses:** Elective courses shall be chosen by each student from a pool of courses. These coursesmaybeinter-departmental, i.e. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) as well as inter-departmental i.e. Generic Elective (GE). The students shall have to choose a minimum number of DSE and GE in every semester as prescribed in the course structure. These courses shall be:
 - i) Supportive to the discipline of study.
 - ii) Providinganexpandedscope.
 - iii) Enablingexposuretosomeotherdiscipline/domain.
 - iv) Nurturingstudentproficiency/Skill.

There shall be a basket of at least Eight Elective Courses having an equal number of credits. For the student of the same discipline/subject, these Elective Courses shall be interdisciplinary and shall be calledDSECourses. If the students of other disciplines/subjects (within the programme) optforthese electives shall be considered interdisciplinary and shall be called GE courses.

Further, there may be few courses conducted under the UGC's Programmes on Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC)s. The university may time to time fixed the criteria for MOOCs as per the relevant UGC guidelines on digital education.



- C) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement Courses shall be of two kinds 'Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses' and 'Skill Enhancement Courses'. These courses shall be interdisciplinary (within the programme) in nature. 'AEC' Courses are courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement.
- i) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): a) Environmental Science (2 Credit), b) CommunicativeEnglish(2Credit)andc)AlternativeEnglish/CommunicativeHindi/MIL(2Credits). ForB.Com.programme,thereshallbeaMulti-DisciplinaryCourseof4Credits.
- ii) **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): (Minimum 4 Credits):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/fieldwork. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students with life skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under these categories is suggestive in nature and each university has complete freedom to suggest theirownpapersunderthiscategorybasedontheirexpertise, specialization, requirements, scope, and need.

- 3) A student shall have to study the academic programme as per the scheme of the programme. Even if a candidateearnstherequirednumberofcreditsbeforecompletionofthefulldurationoftheprogramme, he/she shall not be entitled to the degree.

COURSEENROLLMENT

- 1. The minimum and maximum credits to be opted by a student for qualifying for a graduate degree shall be as per the Course Structure given in Annexure I.
- $2. \ Change of courses shall not be permitted after sending the records of the students to the university for registration.$

PATTERNOFEXAMINATION

- a) Examination and Evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least three times during each semester.
- b) There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for the End-Semester



examination in each course during every semester.

- c) There shallbe no provision for re-evaluation of the answer scriptsof the endsemester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.
- d) Internal Assessment:
 - i) In Internal Assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentations, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.
 - ii) The studentsshall beinformedinadvanceabout thenature oftheassessment. Studentsshall be required to compulsorily attend internal assessment including appearing in the Sessional Tests failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A student cannot repeat the End-semester examination whenever necessary.

(e) EndSemesterExamination:

- i) There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The Endsemester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.
- ii) The Controller of Examinations shall then make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the end semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
- iii) Normally,theEnd-semesterexaminationforeachcourseshallbeofathree-hourduration.
- (f) Confidential Works: Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answerscripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks, etc. and announcements of results, shall be governed by the Dibrugarh University Examination Ordinance.
- (g) The mode of the conduct of the end-semester examinations of the practical/dissertation courses shall be partially external as below:
 - i) Theend-semesterexaminations of all practical/dissertation courses shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of the internal examiner (the concerned course teacher) and an external examiner appointed by the Controller of Examinations.
 - ii) Astudentshallnot beallowedtotakemorethanoneprojectworkinasinglesemester.
- (h) The mode of end-semester examination and evaluation of the Course shall be specified in the detailed syllabus of the Course concerned.
- (i) End-semesterPracticalexaminationsshallnormallybeheldbeforethetheoryexaminations.

BETTERMENTEXAMINATION

1) A student shall be entitled to take the "betterment examinations" in any two theory courses of any ofthesixsemestersafterpassingtheSixthSemesterexaminationonlyonce.Inthiscase,thehigher



markssecured by the students hall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for the betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth Semester examination.

2) Nobettermentshallbeallowedinthepractical examinations.

RESULTS&PROGRESSION

- a) Acandidate, shall be declared as passed a course, provided he/she secures
 - i) Atleast40% marks in each course in the End-semester examinations.


